18.10.2013. Felix Rosenqvist (kfzteile24 Mücke Motorsport, 1:33.692 minutes), one of the two title candidates in the FIA Formula 3 European Championship, set the fastest time in free practice. At the 4.574 kilometres long Hockenheimring Baden-Württemberg, he was 0.095 seconds faster than Alex Lynn (Prema Powerteam, 1:33.787 minutes). The best-placed German, Sven Müller (Van Amersfoort Racing, 1:33.857 minutes) was classified third while points' leader Raffaele Marciello (Prema Powerteam, 1:33.989 minutes) ended up seventh.

Swede Felix Rosenqvist, who is 45.5 points behind Raffaele Marciello as runner-up in the drivers' standings, set the pace for the major part of the faster first half of free practice. Alex Lynn only moved up into second place in the closing stages, toppling Müller to third. Lucas Auer (Prema Powerteam, 1:33.873 minutes), Dennis van de Laar (Van Amersfoort Racing, 1:33.891 minutes) and Harry Tincknell (Carlin, 1:33.977 minutes) were classified in fourth to sixth place, followed by title favourite Raffaele Marciello, who ended up seventh in free practice. Nick Cassidy (Carlin, 1:34.050 minutes), who is in his second weekend as a guest driver in the FIA Formula 3 European Championship after Norisring, claimed eighth place from John Bryant-Meisner (Fortec Motorsports, 1:34.136 minutes). Bryant-Meisner is also in only his second weekend in the successful junior race series. Eddie Cheever (Prema Powerteam, 1:34.150 minutes) rounded out the top ten.

In his first Formula 3 race since the Macau Grand Prix in November 2012, Kevin Korjus (ThreeBond with T-Sport, 1:34.587 minutes) occupied 19th place and was one position ahead of Stefano Coletti (ma-con, 1:34.982 minutes). Coming out of GP2, the Monegasque is making his Formula 3 comeback during the season finale.
